What is Fair Housing Testing?

Fair housing testing is an authentic simulation of a housing transaction used to compare the treatment of one home seeker to another to determine if there are violations of fair housing laws. The technique of testing involves the pairing of individuals, similar in relevant respects except for the variable being tested (e.g., race, familial status, disability.) After the conclusion of the contact or visit, the experiences of the two or more testers are compared to determine whether the alleged discrimination against the complainant exists.

Compensation?

\$50 to \$100 per training; \$35 to \$75 per site test or survey; \$25 per phone test; mileage and transportation expenses paid.

This is not a part time job. It is on-call and on an intermittent basis. It's great if you want to make some extra money and a positive social impact at the same time.

The Rural Fair Housing Center of California Rural Legal Assistance, Inc. (CRLA) is a private, non-profit agency that provides education, counseling, investigation, and enforcement to persons who allege housing discrimination.
